Work plan

Hosted in the picturesque town of Benferri, Spain, with the support of the Provincial Council of Alicante, this five-day international event brings together stakeholders, experts, and enthusiasts from across Europe to explore the latest advancements, best practices, and collaborative opportunities in sustainable agriculture. Against the backdrop of evolving environmental challenges, technological innovations, and socio-economic shifts, the need for sustainable agricultural practices has never been more urgent. This event serves as a platform for knowledge exchange, capacity-building, and networking, as we delve into the principles, applications, and implications of Agriculture 5.0 - the next frontier in agricultural innovation. Through a series of engaging sessions, workshops, and interactive discussions, participants will have the opportunity to gain insights from leading experts, exchange ideas with peers, and discover innovative solutions to pressing challenges facing European agriculture. From harnessing cutting-edge technologies like IoT and AI to promoting social inclusion and community resilience, our event explores the multifaceted dimensions of sustainable agriculture and its role in shaping the future of Europe's rural landscapes.

In this context, the various project partners from Benferri (Spain), La Vera County (Extremadura-Spain), Legrad (Croatia), Krizevci (Croatia), Leuven (Belgium), Vipava (Slovenia), Surdulica (Serbia), Cicevac (Serbia), Siena (Italy), Vila Boa do Bispo (Portugal) and Athienou (Cyprus), they will gather in Benferri to collaborate in reflecting on and generating new ideas for promoting Smart Agriculture and the Green Transition among European rural youth. To achieve this, more than 180 young people and key stakeholders from 8 different countries will participate in debates and joint efforts to develop a decalogue that can serve as a guide for rural areas across Europe on these matters. Other project activities:
